



# REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD AND LIVING OUR FAITH EACH DAY



March 8, 2026  
3rd SUNDAY OF LENT:  
THIRSTING FOR GOD

The story of Moses and water in the desert provides the introduction to the Gospel story. In between we find the Responsorial Psalm that refers to the Israelites as it speaks to us today: being receptive to the mercy and blessings of God. All around us are channels of grace, blessings and peace available to us, but we need to be able to see with eyes of faith, to understand and accept with gratitude what our loving God has offered to us.

This is the first of three very special Sundays for all those who are preparing for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist! As we come nearer the Easter Vigil – the time of Initiation – the Church gives us in this Cycle A three powerfully symbolic Gospel events, since the time of the early Christians. These are “Scrutiny Sundays” for our Elect who will be baptized, confirmed and receive Eucharist for the first time at Easter. And we, already baptized, prepare for the renewal of our Baptism promises at Easter. We focus our preparation on our celebration of the Paschal Mystery of death and resurrection in the weeks ahead. During these three weeks before Passion (Palm) Sunday, we intensify our journey with those who will be baptized.

Our life of faith springs from our baptism through which we have been incorporated into the Body of Christ. Jesus promises the living water of salvation not only to the woman of Samaria, but to all the faithful. While the Gospel story begins with a conversation about water which quenches thirst, it moves to consideration of spiritual thirst. How many of us have experienced thirst, real almost-about-to-die thirst? In the first reading, we hear the Hebrews fleeing Egypt crying out to Moses for water. Through Moses, God hears and responds to their pleas. They find that the Lord is in their midst and attend to their needs.

But what about the thirsts of our hearts – for love, acceptance, trust, forgiveness, for peace of heart, and peace in our world? The woman at the well who speaks with Jesus knows both kinds of thirst. If we delve into our hearts to examine our needs – our hungers and thirsts – I suspect that we would also realize there are many spiritual thirsts we have. Jesus promises us living water – the waters of rebirth and renewal. Paul’s Letter to the Romans reminds us that our faith and hope in God is fulfilled: God proves his love for us. While we are still sinners, Christ loved us so much that he died for us. What greater love is there?

## LENTEN FASTING



The 2026 Lenten message of Pope Leo XIV was given on February 13 titled “Listening and Fasting: Lent as a Time of Conversion”.

Quoting St. Augustine’s work “The Usefulness of Fasting” Pope Leo cited the saint’s observation, “In the course of earthly life, it is incumbent upon men and women to hunger and thirst for justice, but to be satisfied belongs to the next life.” Fasting, he added, helps to identify and properly order our ‘appetites’ “keeping our hunger and thirst for justice alive and freeing us from complacency.”

The ancient practice of fasting from food during Lent can free us from complacency and lead us to “hunger” for God, the Pope said, encouraging Catholics to rediscover the power of fasting this Lent, to embrace the “ancient ascetic practice” of abstaining from food, as well as “refraining from words that offend and hurt our neighbor.” Lent is a time to “place the mystery of God back in the center of our lives, in order to find renewal in our faith and keep our hearts from being consumed by the anxieties and distractions of daily life.”

“Abstaining from food is an ancient ascetic practice that is essential on the path of conversion,” he wrote. “Precisely because it involves the body, fasting makes it easier to recognize what we ‘hunger’ for and what we deem necessary for our sustenance.”

Pope Leo said that “understood in this way, fasting not only permits us to govern our desire, purifying it and making it freer, but also to expand it, so that it is directed towards God and doing good.” The pope also encouraged parishes, families and religious communities to “undertake a shared journey during Lent,” emphasizing “the communal aspect of listening to the word and fasting. The Lenten journey is a welcome opportunity to heed the voice of the Lord and renew our commitment to following Christ.



## SEDIENTOS DE LAS AGUAS QUE DAN VIDA

Especialmente durante la Cuaresma, la Semana Santa y el tiempo de Pascua, los textos de oración de la Iglesia Occidental se deleitan con imágenes paradójicas de Cristo: la vida eterna que muere, el anfitrión de la cena que es también alimento, el crucificado

sediento del que mana agua de vida de su costado. Estas imágenes fluyen de las representaciones de Jesús por parte de los evangelistas y de su mismísimo ministerio, durante el cual muchas veces cambió o invirtió las expectativas que las personas tenían sobre él o sobre los designios de Dios. Esta "inversión" está en juego en el Evangelio de hoy, cuando Jesús habla con una extranjera enemiga que está por debajo de su condición social. Además él, el que tiene sed, demuestra que la mujer es la única que tiene sed verdadera. Él -cuyos labios secos dirán "Tengo sed" antes de morir- es la fuente de vida y del agua que da vida. La Cuaresma nos llama a reflexionar sobre cómo cada uno de nosotros tiene sed de Cristo y nos lleva, en última instancia, de vuelta a las aguas dadoras de vida de nuestro bautismo en su Cuerpo.

## Un Poco Sobre la Confirmación

Para ser cristiano en la Iglesia católica necesitas recibir los tres sacramentos de Iniciación, es decir, el Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía. Si te falta uno de estos sacramentos no estás completamente iniciado.

Algunos cristianos insisten que si no estás confirmado no te puedes casar por la Iglesia, pero esto no es completamente cierto. Según las leyes de la Iglesia, los cristianos que desean contraer Matrimonio deberían buscar ser confirmados, si les es posible sin grave dificultad (Canon 1065). Todos conocemos el Bautismo y la Eucaristía, pero ¿qué es la Confirmación? El nombre lo dice todo. Con la Confirmación, confirmamos ante Dios y la Iglesia que deseamos ser cristianos por el resto de nuestra vida. Confirmarse es comprometerse, es entregarse al servicio de Dios ayudando al prójimo con la gracia y el poder del Espíritu Santo. Por eso es importante recibir una buena preparación. La mayoría de nosotros no tuvimos opción cuando nuestra mamá y nuestro papá nos bautizaron. Nuestros padres y padrinos dijeron sí por nosotros y, si cumplieron con su compromiso, nos enseñaron con palabras y buen ejemplo como decir sí al Evangelio de Cristo. Sea que nos hayamos bautizado como infantes o como adultos, la Confirmación nos da la oportunidad de dar un sí pleno. ¡Sí! a ese bautizo, ¡Sí! a la Iglesia y en especial ¡Sí! a Cristo.

El pasado domingo, en la solemnidad propia de este tiempo de gracia, nuestros catecúmenos -adultos que se preparan con fervor para recibir los sacramentos de la iniciación cristiana: Bautismo, Confirmación y Eucaristía- fueron recibidos por el Rvdo. Padre Rafael Partida, Vicario Episcopal, quien actuó en nombre y representación de S.E.R. Mons. Alberto Rojas, Obispo de nuestra diócesis. El acto tuvo lugar en la parroquia de Santa Francisca Xavier Cabrini, en la ciudad de Yucaipa, donde se celebró con profunda reverencia el "Rito de Elección", también conocido como "Rito de Inscripción de los Nombres".

Este rito constituye uno de los momentos culminantes y más significativos en el camino del "Orden de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos (OCIA)". Con él se cierra formalmente el prolongado período del catecumenado -etapa de formación, conversión y discernimiento- y se inaugura la fase de preparación inmediata para los sacramentos de iniciación. Desde ese instante, la Iglesia los reconoce y proclama solemnemente como "los Elegidos".

La ceremonia, que incluyó la inscripción de sus nombres en el libro de los Elegidos, resultó profundamente emotiva e inspiradora para toda la asamblea. En su homilía, el Padre Rafael Partida expresó con vigorosa fe que, al quedar registrados sus nombres, los Elegidos han pasado a formar parte indeleble de la historia viva de la Iglesia, inscritos para siempre en su memoria hasta el fin de los tiempos. Con palabras cargadas de emoción les dijo:

"Ustedes son ahora personas de gran importancia en el mundo, porque Dios mismo los ha elegido. Pronto, en la noche santa de la Vigilia Pascual, los recibiremos como hijos de Dios y, por el Bautismo, los llamaremos con toda verdad "hermanos en Cristo"".

Asimismo, dirigió un exhorto memorable a toda la comunidad de bautizados, recordándonos la grave responsabilidad que nos incumbe: acoger con amor fraterno, acompañar con fidelidad y sostener con nuestra oración y ejemplo a estos Elegidos en su camino hacia la plena incorporación a la vida de la Iglesia.

La comunidad parroquial de "Nuestra Señora de la Asunción" ha acompañado con constancia y devoción a estos futuros hijos de Dios desde el año pasado. Juntos celebramos el "Rito de Entrada" en noviembre, cuando les dimos la bienvenida formal al iniciar su indagación en la fe católica. Más adelante, participamos en el "Rito de la Unción con el óleo de los catecúmenos" y, en otra fecha, en el "Rito de Envío", mediante el cual la asamblea los encomendó solemnemente al Rito de Elección que ahora ha tenido lugar.

A partir de este domingo y durante los próximos, los Elegidos participarán en los "Ritos de los Escrutinios", que se celebrarán en las Misas del tercer, cuarto y quinto domingo de Cuaresma. (En un artículo posterior explicaré con mayor detalle el profundo significado de estos ritos).

Que María, Madre de la Iglesia, los guarde y los conduzca hasta la Pascua de Resurrección.

## SAINT LEANDER OF SEVILLE - MARCH 13

SAINT LEANDER WAS BORN TO A WEALTHY ROMAN FAMILY IN THE 500'S. THE FAMILY MOVED TO SEVILLE, IN SPAIN.

Last Sunday, on the solemnity proper to this time of grace, our catechumens—adults who are preparing with fervor to receive the sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist—were received by the Reverend Father Rafael Partida, Episcopal Vicar, who acted in the name and on behalf of His Excellency Most Reverend Alberto Rojas, Bishop of our diocese. The ceremony took place at the parish of Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, in the city of Yucaipa, where the Rite of Election, also known as the Rite of Enrollment of Names, was celebrated with profound reverence.

This rite marks one of the culminating and most significant moments in the path of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). With it, the long period of the catechumenate—a stage of formation, conversion, and discernment—formally concludes, and the phase of immediate preparation for the sacraments of initiation begins. From that moment onward, the Church recognizes and solemnly proclaims them as the Elect.

The ceremony, which included the enrollment of their names in the Book of the Elect, was deeply moving and inspiring for the entire assembly. In his homily, Father Rafael Partida expressed with vigorous faith that, by having their names recorded, the Elect have now become an indelible part of the living history of the Church, inscribed forever in its memory until the end of time. With words filled with emotion, he told them:

“You are now people of great importance in the world, because God Himself has chosen you. Soon, on the holy night of the Easter Vigil, we will receive you as children of God and, through Baptism, we will truly call you brothers and sisters in Christ.”

He also delivered a memorable exhortation to the entire community of the baptized, reminding us of the serious responsibility we bear: to welcome these Elect with fraternal love, to accompany them faithfully, and to sustain them with our prayers and example on their journey toward full incorporation into the life of the Church.

The parish community of Our Lady of the Assumption has accompanied these future children of God with constancy and devotion since last year. Together we celebrated the Rite of Entry in November, when we formally welcomed them as they began their inquiry into the Catholic faith. Later, we participated in the Rite of Anointing with the Oil of Catechumens and, on another occasion, in the Rite of Sending, through which the assembly solemnly entrusted them to the Rite of Election that has now taken place.

Beginning this Sunday and over the coming weeks, the Elect will participate in the Scrutinies, which will be celebrated during the Masses of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent. (In a future article, I will explain in greater detail the profound meaning of these rites.)

May Mary, Mother of the Church, protect them and lead them to the Easter of Resurrection.
