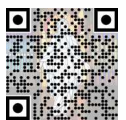

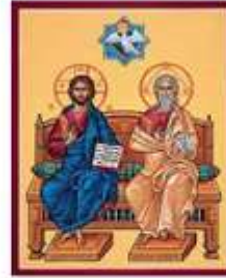
Jesus knew that the lives of his disciples would not be easy. It isn't an issue of knowing that we are Christians, called to be disciples. We are pretty aware of our baptismal community and usually aware of our obligations. Today's Scriptures speak of the challenge, cost, and the blessings of discipleship.

Jeremiah, the prophet, knew that he had made people unhappy, made some enemies by his preaching. The segment we hear today is followed by an anguished cry, which comes from the depths of a man who also knew that at the end of it all, the Lord was faithful and rescued the poor. Paul's letter to the Romans reminds them, and us as well, that God's grace and the redemption of Jesus are greater than the sin of Adam and our sin. It is in the time of persecution, of difficulty in following the Way of Christ, that we need to remember both God's care for us and our call to faithfulness.

Both of those are woven into the Gospel proclamation: Jesus is continuing his instruction to the disciples as he sends them on their missionary journey. God's great care for us far exceeds knowing the number of hairs on our head – it is wider and deeper than that. When we are faithful to Jesus Christ, Jesus himself is our advocate to the Father. He is our companion and support.

It is in our daily life that we live out that faithfulness – the choices we make day by day, the priorities we live by. We witness our faith most likely less by words spoken than deeds done. The compassion and care we show to others, the generosity and selflessness of the time we give to and for others – these are testimony of our faithfulness to the Gospel and to Jesus. Such actions are sure to be blessed. Jesus is always with us; our celebration of Eucharist and receiving Holy Communion is, indeed, the Bread of Life, our spiritual food for the journey of faith. We affirm that we belong to God in and through Jesus Christ. And we affirm that we belong to God, secure in God's grace and love.

## FAITH AND FATHERS

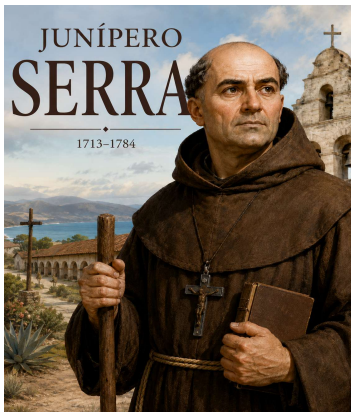


One of the most familiar prayers of Christian may be the "Our Father". Sometimes it is good to step back a bit and take time to reflect on what we are really praying about. A chapter of Gerhard Lohfink's book on a new reading of the OUR FATHER offers this:

*"The Our Father is primarily a prayer for disciples. Every line is about disciples forgetting their own desires and plans for their lives and desiring only what God wills. In that sense it is a dangerous prayer for anyone who prays it."* It was presented to early catechumens (and also is today) as they prepared to be baptized into the Christian community. This prayer of Jesus becomes for many of us so routine that it feels both familiar and bland. We have prayed this with our parents, grandparents, godparents, teachers and catechists as well as the faith community in worship. We gather from them, our real-world life's catechists, what it means to pray and live our faith.



In this reflection we focus on the "father" of the prayer. For many years in Christian Initiation ministries, our annual "Our Father Retreat" was an enriching and deepening exploration of the meaning of this prayer in our growing faith and in our daily lives. Re-reading the sections of the Gospels of Matthew (Ch. 6) and Luke (Ch. 11) we find the prototype of the words we pray, and especially a model for prayer. In attitude, our praying is like the Jewish "tefillah" – the labor of awakening the hidden love within our hearts as we grow toward a state of intimate union with God. Jesus has invited us to call God our Father, "Abba", a term of reverence, familiarity and respect. Our fathers and those who fulfill the role of fathers, guides and models in our lives may well echo and personalize the relationship Jesus offers us throughout the Gospels. That can mean that this familiar prayer and the word "Father" deserve some deep reflection and tremendous gratitude. Let us pray... Amen



En 1769 los misioneros franciscanos establecieron la primera misión en lo que hoy es la ciudad de San Diego, California. Bajo la dirección de fray Junípero Serra, los hermanos menores pudieron establecer otras ocho misiones, incluyendo la ciudad de San Francisco, en 1776. Junípero o José Miguel Serra, fue hijo de padres campesinos de la Isla de Mallorca, España.

Ingresó a la Orden de los hermanos menores (franciscanos) a los dieciséis años y con el tiempo, llegó a ser profesor de filosofía, pero su verdadero deseo era ser misionero en el continente americano, lo que hoy conocemos como Hemisferio Occidental. En 1749, su orden religiosa lo envió a México como administrador del Colegio Apostólico. Poco a poco se fue desprendiendo de sus cargos académicos para establecer misiones entre los indígenas. Aunque algunos afirman lo contrario, Junípero fue arduo defensor de los nativos. En California, más de una vez tuvo problemas con los soldados españoles, debido a que éstos abusaban de los amerindios, problemas que lo llevaron a defender los derechos humanos de los nativos ante el Virrey en México. Sus esfuerzos por cristianizar los indígenas de California tuvieron como resultado más de 6000 bautizos durante sus quince años en esa región.

# JUAN EL BAUTISTA



Juan nació de Zacarías y santa Isabel, una pareja anciana y estéril. Humanamente parecía imposible que tuvieran un hijo, pero Dios intervino para mostrar que Juan tenía una misión especial. Su nacimiento recuerda otros nacimientos milagrosos del Antiguo Testamento, como el de Isaac o Samuel.

El ángel Gabriel anunció a Zacarías que su hijo se llamaría Juan, nombre que significa aproximadamente "Dios es misericordioso" o "Dios ha mostrado favor". Esto es importante porque Juan no vino simplemente como un niño esperado por sus padres, sino como un enviado de Dios.

La misión de Juan fue preparar el camino para Jesucristo. Por eso la Iglesia lo llama el Precursor del Señor. Antes de que Jesús comenzara públicamente su ministerio, Juan predicó la conversión, llamó al arrepentimiento y bautizó en el río Jordán. Su vida entera apuntaba hacia Cristo.

También es significativo que Juan fue santificado desde el vientre de su madre. Cuando María visitó a Isabel, el niño saltó de alegría en el vientre de Isabel al estar cerca de Jesús, que estaba en el vientre de María. La tradición católica ve en este momento una señal de la gracia especial que Dios dio a Juan antes de nacer.

La Iglesia celebra solemnemente su nacimiento el 24 de junio, algo poco común, porque normalmente los santos se celebran el día de su muerte. En el caso de Juan, se celebra su nacimiento porque desde el principio estuvo marcado por una misión divina única: anunciar la llegada del Mesías.

El nacimiento de Juan el Bautista muestra que Dios cumple sus promesas, actúa incluso cuando todo parece imposible, y prepara cuidadosamente la venida de Jesucristo al mundo.

## Liturgical Prayers

Deeply Rooted in History



The Eucharistic Prayers at the heart of our liturgy have a long history, beginning with the extemporaneous prayers of the early Christians. The presiders gave thanks from their hearts, not from any prearranged text, over the gifts of bread and wine. When the assembly had the sense that enough was said, someone would call out "Amen!" and that was that. For the most part, the plan flowed directly from Jewish meal prayers, which always recalled God's mighty deeds. Some other markers and signposts were added almost everywhere fairly early, like the presider's call to attention: "Lift up your hearts!" Scholars have provided us with translations of many early texts. These have actually helped us craft new liturgical prayers, because until the liturgical reforms of forty years ago, no one could recall any prayer but the Roman Canon, now called Eucharistic Prayer I. For hundreds of years in the West, it was our only Eucharistic Prayer, and it was only in Latin. But the history of our Eucharistic Prayers is amazingly fruitful, and models have come down to us that have yielded new insights and expressions. The old custom of improvising texts according to a master plan has not endured, but we have now rediscovered a plan of standardizing the text while allowing for a great variety.
