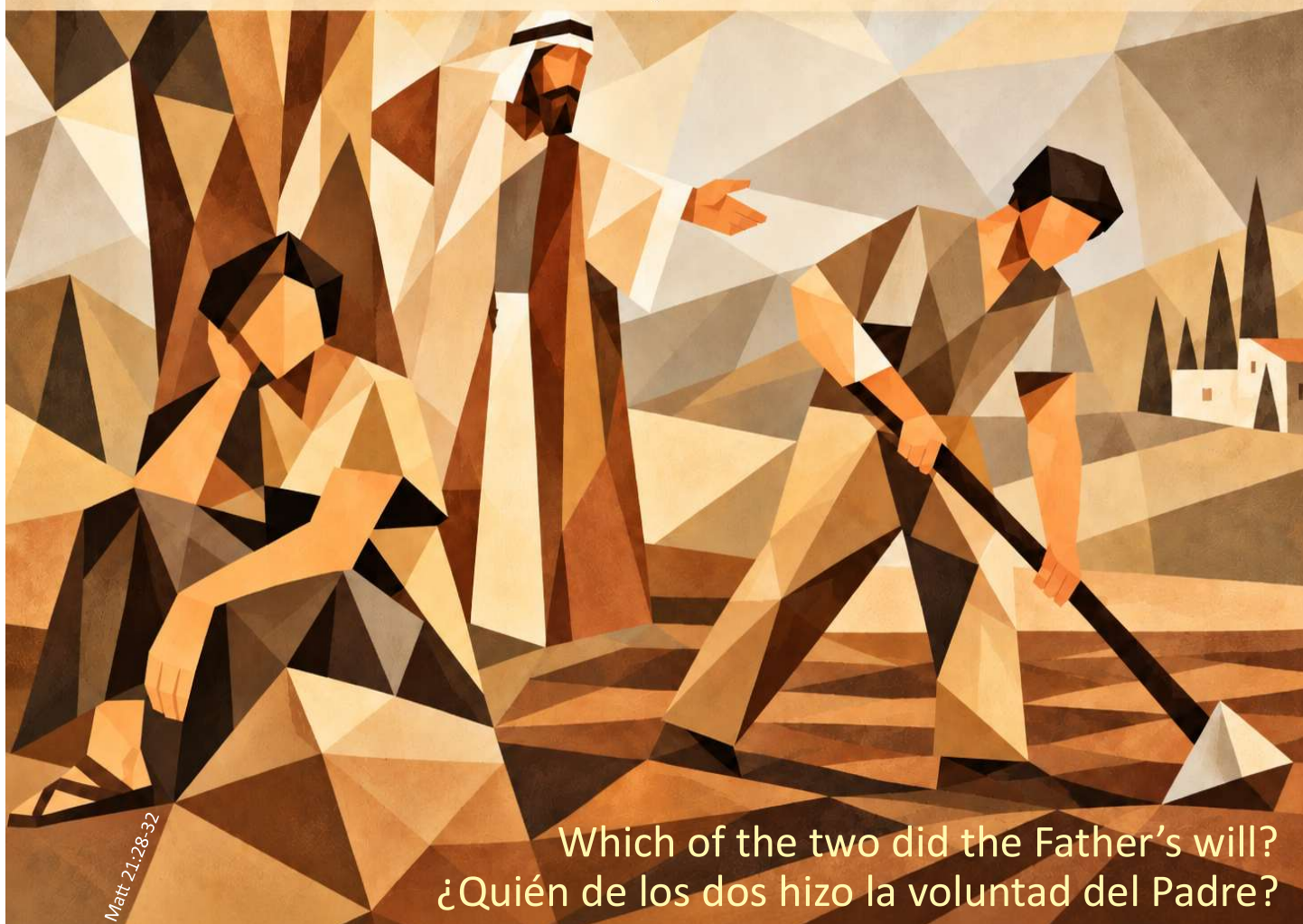

26th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
GOD'S WAY

Although it may seem far away, the close of the liturgical year is coming nearer, and the Sunday Scriptures are reminding us of the coming Final Judgment. The Gospel speaks so strongly of

conversion, of our ability to respond to the prompting of grace – the Spirit – and to turn our hearts and minds to the will of God. A theme in all the readings is that we are called to be faithful to the Word of God, to the Way of God revealed through the prophets and through Jesus, first lived out by the apostles, disciples and members of the early Church. Their wisdom is shared with us through these Scriptures and the prayers of the Mass.

Today, when I re-read the message from the prophet Ezekiel, I was struck by the words "Hear now, house of Israel". I am reminded of the *Shema*, the precious twice daily prayer of the people of Israel, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is One" (Deuteronomy 6:4). That familiar prayer leads to teaching about right living, in accord with the God of the Covenant and the commandments. Faith leads to and guides action, and it is through our actions that our faith becomes visible and credible. The Responsorial asks the Lord to remember his mercies – and in doing so reminds us to remember the mercy and goodness of the Lord, thereby encouraging full-hearted devotion to the Lord and daily discipleship. We find that not necessarily so simple as it

sounds. Paul's Letter to the Philippians spells it out in some detail and affirms the example of Jesus Christ.



We are encouraged by the Gospel parable and the key question from Jesus to his

listeners: "Which of the two [sons] did his father's will?" Indeed, Jesus strengthens the teaching that it is through our decisions and actions that our faith and obedience to the will of the Father become evident, not simply our words. Words alone are insufficient. One insight is that this parable reveals a "God of Second Chances", the kind of God of justice and mercy that we seek, to whom we can turn when our hearts reveal to us the need for conversion and renewed obedience and fidelity. May our minds and hearts be open to the hope and the invitation to change that this Sunday's Scriptures offer to us.



WINDOWS OF FAITH

As we take time to explore our church building, the gathering place for our community to worship, pray, sing and grow in faith, there are so many things we can learn. With helpful research by Richard Doyle and Phil Colella during the 1990's, we found that the round stained-glass windows in the church were added after the original yellow glass ones were removed about 10 years after the church was first dedicated, though some information has been lost. In addition to the brief descriptions given on our parish website, there are two ring binders in the vestibule of the church with more complete information.

The ones most familiar to us might be the images of the sacred hearts of Jesus and Mary, in the north wall of the sanctuary, though interestingly these are on the opposite east and west sides of the church than where the niche statues are in the church itself. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is positioned above the tabernacle and the Sacred Heart of Mary is on the same side of the church as the small shrine to Our Lady of Guadalupe toward the back of the church. The signature image of Our Lady of the Assumption is the window positioned in the loft, on the south wall of the church, so that each time we enter, gather, or leave the church we do so under that attentive care of our Blessed Mother. That large window and some of the statues in the church were gifts through donations by some parishioners given decades ago to the parish community.

Less familiar would be the stained-glass windows in the sacristy (St. Luke), Family Chapel (St. Paul and Saint Joseph), the Reconciliation Room, and by the stairs to the



loft. Many of us may enjoy the colors of light filtering into the church on a sunny day, but that light comes to us through the intercession of sunshine and the symbols of the apostles, evangelists, and the Holy Family. Take time to look up, study the symbols of the saints, and check out the information by scrolling down on the parish website to the section about the meaning of the symbols of the stained-glass windows. Enjoy a bit more insight into our parish church and the saints who surround us and give us beautiful light.

LA MANERA DE DIOS

Aunque pueda parecer que aún falta mucho, el final del año litúrgico se acerca, y las Escrituras de los domingos nos están recordando la

llegada del Juicio Final. El Evangelio habla con gran fuerza de la conversión, de nuestra capacidad de responder a la inspiración de la gracia —del Espíritu— y de volver nuestro corazón y nuestra mente hacia la voluntad de Dios. Un tema presente en todas las lecturas es que estamos llamados a ser fieles a la Palabra de Dios, al Camino de Dios revelado por medio de los profetas y de Jesús, y vivido primeramente por los apóstoles, los discípulos y los miembros de la Iglesia primitiva. Su sabiduría se comparte con nosotros a través de estas Escrituras y de las oraciones de la Misa.

Hoy, al volver a leer el mensaje del profeta Ezequiel, me llamaron la atención las palabras: «Escucha ahora, casa de Israel». Esto me recuerda el Shemá, la preciosa oración que el pueblo de Israel reza dos veces al día: «Escucha, Israel: el Señor, nuestro Dios, es el único Señor» (Deuteronomio 6,4). Esta conocida oración conduce a una enseñanza sobre cómo vivir rectamente, de acuerdo con el Dios de la Alianza y sus mandamientos. La fe conduce a la acción y la orienta, y es por medio de nuestras acciones que nuestra fe se hace visible y creíble. El Salmo Responsorial pide al Señor que recuerde sus misericordias y, al hacerlo, también nos recuerda a nosotros que tengamos presentes la misericordia y la bondad del Señor, alentándonos así a una entrega de todo corazón al Señor y a un discipulado vivido cada día. Descubrimos que esto no siempre es tan sencillo como parece. La Carta de san Pablo a los Filipenses lo explica con mayor detalle y nos presenta el ejemplo de Jesucristo.

La parábola del Evangelio nos anima, especialmente por la pregunta fundamental que Jesús dirige a quienes lo escuchan: «¿Cuál de los dos [hijos] hizo la voluntad de su padre?». En efecto, Jesús refuerza la enseñanza de que es mediante nuestras decisiones y nuestras acciones como se hacen evidentes nuestra fe y nuestra obediencia a la voluntad del Padre, y no simplemente por nuestras palabras. Las palabras por sí solas no son suficientes. Una enseñanza importante de esta parábola es que nos revela a un «Dios de segundas oportunidades», el Dios de justicia y misericordia que buscamos y a quien podemos acudir cuando nuestro corazón nos hace reconocer la necesidad de conversión, de una obediencia renovada y de una fidelidad renovada. Que nuestra mente y nuestro corazón permanezcan abiertos a la esperanza y a la invitación al cambio que las Escrituras de este domingo nos ofrecen.

Nos vemos este jueves entrante aquí en la iglesia.



La Virgen del Rosario

La práctica de usar nudos en una cuerda para contar oraciones tiene una larga trayectoria en la fe cristiana. Originalmente un cordón con 150 nudos o piedritas se usaba para contar la recitación de los 150 salmos encontrados en la Sagrada Escritura. Con el tiempo, visto que mucha gente no podía leer o recitar de memoria los salmos, se sustituyeron por el uso de 150 Padrenuestros. A finales de la Edad

Media muchos sustituyeron los Padrenuestros con el saludo del ángel Gabriel a María. En el siglo XVI se formuló lo que hoy reconocemos como el Avemaría, y en el año 1569, el Papa Pío V estableció el Rosario en su forma y uso actual. En 1592 un fraile dominico mandó hacer una imagen de la Virgen del Rosario para su convento en Guatemala. Según la leyenda, María viajaba por América con su Hijo y éste se quedó dormido en Guatemala, por lo cual se quedaron allí. En 1821 los independentistas guatemaltecos tomaron a la Virgen del Rosario como protectora y en 1833 fue nombrada patrona oficial de Guatemala.

A LIVING SACRIFICE IN CHRIST

Eucharistic Prayer IV, composed in the 1960s and inspired by the ancient Alexandrian tradition, has a distinctive structure. After the consecration, the Holy Spirit is invoked again so that those who receive Communion may be united as "one body" and become "a living sacrifice in Christ to the praise of your glory." This beautiful phrase invites reflection: What is the goal of your reception of Holy Communion today? The preface of Eucharistic Prayer IV is permanently connected to the prayer, which limits its use mainly to Ordinary Time. It cannot normally be used when a Mass has its own proper preface, such as during Lent, funerals, or major feasts. Though less frequently heard today, its rich scriptural imagery and beautiful language make it worthy of thoughtful attention.
