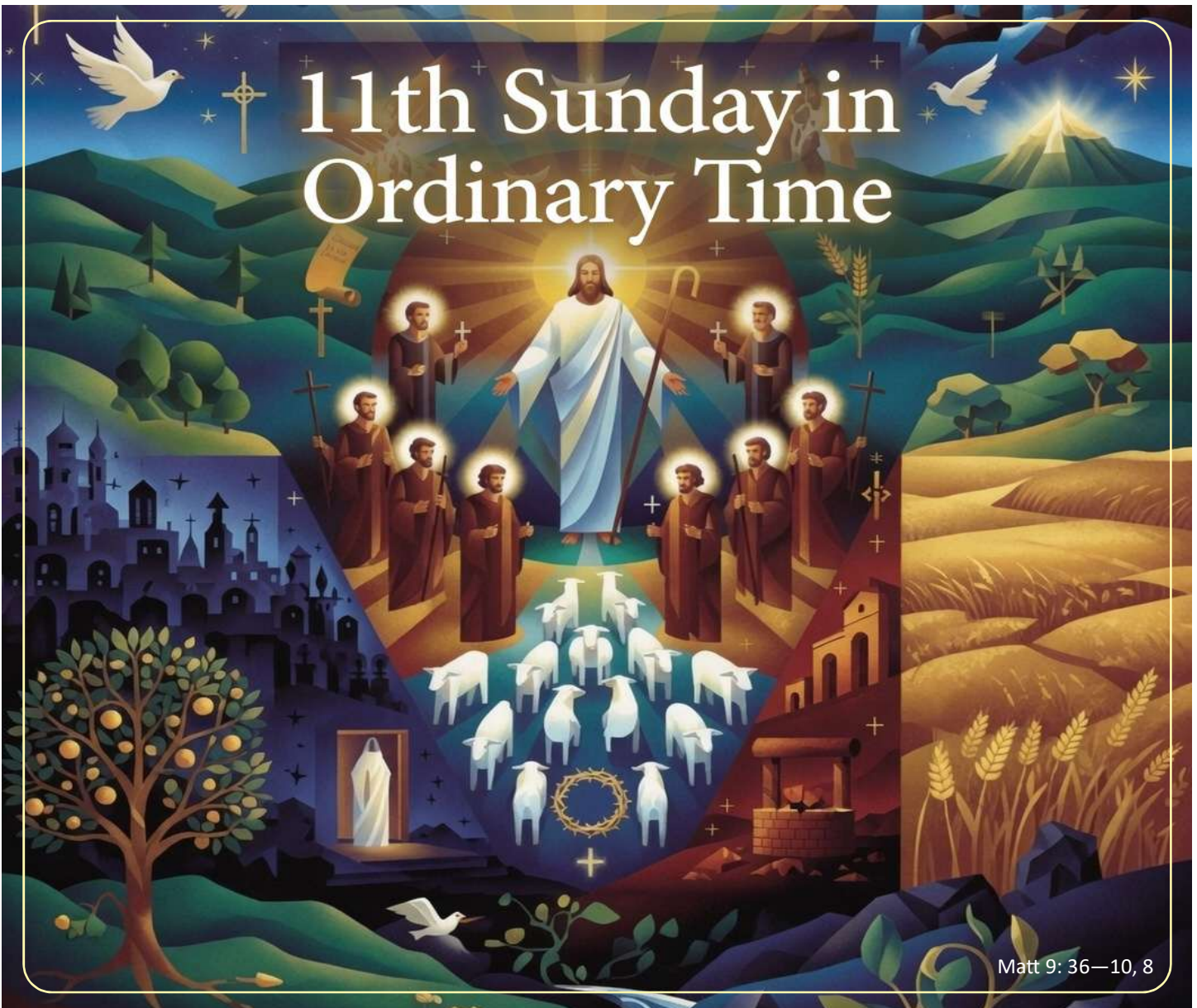

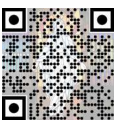

# REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD AND LIVING OUR FAITH EACH DAY

It has been a long time since we've seen green vestments at Sunday Mass. It was in February just before Ash Wednesday! Following Lent and Easter, Pentecost closed the Easter Season and the Church resumed

its "Ordinary Time" Liturgical season. The following two Sundays have been special solemnities, and just this past week we have celebrated the novena and the feast of the Sacred Heart, especially noted as our nation's bishops led us in dedicating our country to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, honoring our nation's 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of independence.

The opening words of the Collect of today's Mass are: "O God, strength of those who hope in you..." These are words of faith we want to pray and hear: "grant us the help of your grace." With graduations, weddings, travel plans, summer events, health concerns and so much more, it is opportune to remind ourselves and one another of how central our faith and trust are in moving forward with our lives. The Collect expresses the theme of the readings and is a wonderful way to gather the cares and prayers of the community as we gather to worship.

Paul's letter to the Romans continues his teaching to the Christians that God's abundant mercy and love has reconciled them even while they were in sin: God's love is so overwhelming that God sent his Son to reconcile and save those who believe, who belong to God. Paul introduces to us one of the mysteries of the Church – that God's love and mercy are deeper and stronger than any of our sins might be, if only we believe, if only we turn to God in reconciliation.

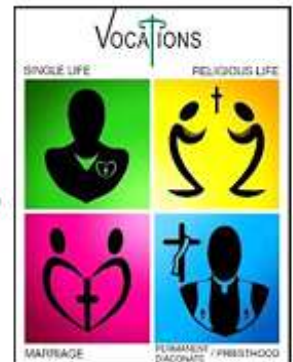
It is in the Gospel of Matthew that we understand, not only belonging to God, echoing the reading from Exodus, but the mission given by Jesus to those who follow him – to go first to those whom God had chosen ages ago – the Israelites – and to reach out in healing and mercy. Our mission, then, as disciples and apostles in this day, is to reach out to all God's people, to care, to heal, to offer compassion and hope to others. That is how we respond to God's love and compassion shown to us: called to the Mission empowered by the graces of Pentecost, our baptism and Confirmation and nourished by the Eucharist. Amen.

## LITURGY'S TRANSFORMING POWER

The theme of the 7th and final article of this USCCB series focuses on VOCATIONS. "The liturgy has the power to transform us into a people who care for and cultivate vocations in the Church." Sometimes a sentence like that is a call to listen more attentively to the prayers we say: in Eucharistic Prayer II we pray our gratitude that God has made the Church a "chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own", words taken from the first letter of Peter.

When we reflect on the Gospels with a lens of discerning discipleship, we can recognize that Jesus not only called disciples to accompany Him in his mission, he formed them to announce the Lord's mercy and to teach and heal in his name and the name of God. He affirmed the good work being done by others to serve the others with faith and generous kindness. In the community of the Church, participation in the mission and ministries of Jesus are further specified initially by the baptismal graces and the gifts of the Holy Spirit strengthened through Confirmation. The continuing discernment of us members responds to the call of God in our vocational lives: some are called to marriage, others to ordination, some to religious profession, and others to dedicated single life. We are all called to be God's laborers in the vineyard of the world.

The sacraments and the blessings of vocation take place within liturgies, celebrations of the whole faith community which also give the faithful the opportunity to acknowledge and celebrate the spirited response of those publicly responding to God's call and grace. There are special Masses with readings and prayers for priests, Church ministers, the laity, and religious as well for anniversaries of marriage and jubilees of religious profession and ordination. The journey of faith travels many paths, May we continue to pray with and for one another.



# ESPERANZA, FE Y VALENTÍA

Ha pasado mucho tiempo desde que vimos vestiduras verdes en la Misa dominical.



¡Fue en febrero, justo antes del Miércoles de Ceniza! Después de la Cuaresma y la Pascua, Pentecostés cerró el Tiempo Pascual y la Iglesia retomó su temporada litúrgica del “Tiempo Ordinario”. Los dos domingos siguientes han sido solemnidades especiales, y justo esta semana pasada celebramos la novena y la fiesta del Sagrado Corazón, especialmente notable porque los obispos de nuestra nación nos guiaron en la consagración de nuestro país al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, honrando el 250 aniversario de la independencia de nuestra nación.

Las palabras iniciales de la Colecta de la Misa de hoy son: “Oh Dios, fuerza de los que esperan en ti...”. Estas son palabras de fe que queremos orar y escuchar: “concédenos la ayuda de tu gracia”. Con las graduaciones, bodas, planes de viaje, eventos de verano, preocupaciones de salud y tantas cosas más, es oportuno recordarnos mutuamente cuán central es nuestra fe y confianza para avanzar en nuestras vidas. La Colecta expresa el tema de las lecturas y es una forma maravillosa de reunir las preocupaciones y oraciones de la comunidad mientras nos reunimos para adorar.

La carta de Pablo a los Romanos continúa su enseñanza a los cristianos de que la abundante misericordia y el amor de Dios los ha reconciliado incluso mientras estaban en el pecado: el amor de Dios es tan abrumador que Dios envió a su Hijo para reconciliar y salvar a los que creen, a los que pertenecen a Dios. Pablo nos introduce a uno de los misterios de la Iglesia: que el amor y la misericordia de Dios son más profundos y fuertes que cualquiera de nuestros pecados, con tal de que creamos, con tal de que nos volvamos a Dios en la reconciliación.

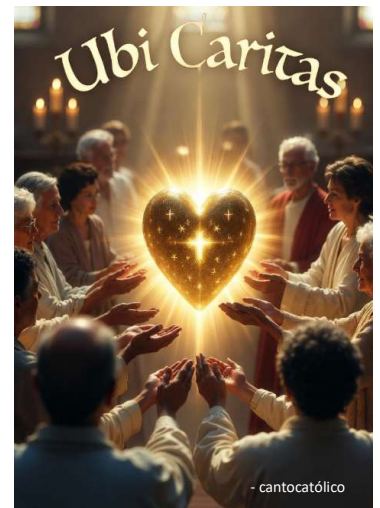
Es en el Evangelio de Mateo donde entendemos no solo el pertenecer a Dios —haciendo eco de la lectura del Éxodo—, sino también la misión que Jesús da a quienes lo siguen: ir primero a aquellos que Dios había elegido hace siglos —los israelitas— y extenderse en sanación y misericordia. Nuestra misión, entonces, como discípulos y apóstoles en este día, es llegar a todo el pueblo de Dios, cuidar, sanar, ofrecer compasión y esperanza a los demás. Así es como respondemos al amor y la compasión de Dios mostrados hacia nosotros: llamados a la Misión, fortalecidos por las gracias de Pentecostés, nuestro Bautismo y Confirmación, y alimentados por la Eucaristía. # Saint Romuald, Abbot
