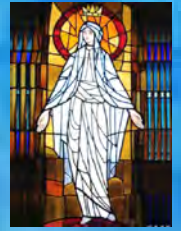

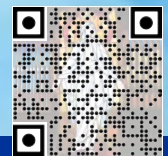

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD AND LIVING OUR FAITH EACH DAY



May 4, 2025
THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER:
WITH THE RISEN JESUS

As we listen to the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we hear that Peter and the apostles are willing to defy the Sanhedrin and continue to preach and teach about Jesus Christ, witnessing to their faith and courage. What a contrast the grace of the Holy Spirit has given them that they have changed from earlier choices in the face of Jesus' arrest, passion and death. The post-resurrection appearances of Jesus and his interaction with the apostles have made a difference. They have spent time with the risen Christ and have received the Holy Spirit.

Each Sunday during the Easter season, the Church gives us the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, telling us of the life of disciples in the early Church, their witness, challenges, and the blessings of spreading the Good News. Today we hear of the preparation of an early morning meal of fish and bread which Jesus shares with the disciples. We also hear, in this Sunday's Gospel, of the three-fold affirmation by Peter of his love for Jesus. The response of Jesus is to give Peter the mission to feed the flock, the believers who will come to hear the Good News and be nourished by it.

We share in that new life when we listen to the Word and take it to heart. Because we have experienced the new life of Easter, a renewed, deeper life in Christ, we can have the courage that Peter modeled for us – to proclaim our love of God time and time again. We can give our lives, our hearts to God because we have first been given life by God. Despite what we encounter in a world that challenges and tests our faith, we are called to be faithful and courageous disciples. That is the grace of Confirmation, and the strength we receive in the gift of Eucharist. Each Sunday the Church both invites and obliges us to celebrate Eucharist because we need that grace and the fellowship and support of the community to continue to be faithful disciples!

God has filled the nets of our lives with many blessings. How aware are we of those blessings and how do we respond to God's gifts? Bringing others to know Jesus better does not mean doing big things; it means living our daily lives in the spirit of the Gospel – reflecting the abundance of blessings God has given and the faith that dwells within us.



During these 50 days of Easter, the Church

gives us the opportunity to "unpack" the meaning and rites of Easter. For those newly baptized, this is called a time of mystagogy, studying the mysteries of faith.

Just as certain families bring out their best of everything for special occasions, the Church does so as well. Two magnificent prayers are part of the Easter Vigil but we don't often take time to re-read them or reflect on them. The Exultet is the hymn of praise sung just after the Paschal Candle has been brought into church to illumine the community through the sharing in the Light of Christ. We have completed our sung dialogue: "The Light of Christ." "Thanks be to God." Now in that sung prayer we call on the angels, the earth and the church to rejoice, so much so that we ask that this holy building shake with joy with the voices of the people!

Recalling our salvation history, the prayer hymn speaks of the death of Jesus wiping clean the sin of Adam and tells of the importance of the Passover when the blood of the lamb was put on the doorposts of believers. "This is the night" when the children of Israel were led from slavery through the Red Sea. "This is the night" when the pillar of fire guided them on their journey. "This is the night" when Christ broke the prison-bars of death. The sanctifying power of this night, we pray, dispels wickedness and restores innocence. And we pray that the flame of this Light be found still burning by the Morning Star that never sets, that this peaceful light be shed on the world.



RECONOCIENDO LA PRESENCIA DE JESÚS

Las lecturas del tiempo de Pascua continúan desarrollando para nosotros el gran Misterio Pascual: la presencia permanente de Jesús entre nosotros y lo que puede significar la ‘nueva vida en Cristo’. El Evangelio de hoy narra la tercera aparición de Jesús a los discípulos después de su resurrección.

Al principio no lo reconocen; luego hay una gran pesca seguida de una comida. Después, en la versión larga de este Evangelio, se le da el mandato a Pedro de guiar al rebaño en el amor. Se necesita fe para reconocer la presencia de Jesús entre nosotros. La realidad puede cambiar y las cosas buenas resultan cuando lo hacemos. Todas las comidas que compartimos son recuerdos de la comida eucarística que nos mantiene en comunión con la vida de Cristo resucitado y entre nosotros. Jesús sigue siendo alimento y fuerza para el camino. Nuestra fe se construye sobre el amor. En su diálogo con Cristo, Pedro reafirma tres veces su amor por él, revirtiendo su triple negación de Jesús antes de la crucifixión. Pedro es líder, pero su liderazgo se construye sobre su amor a Cristo. No es la autoridad de la tiranía, sino del cuidado pastoral. Pedro debe ‘apacentar mis corderos’, los jóvenes, los vulnerables. Debe ‘cuidar de mis ovejas’, alimentando y cuidando del rebaño, atendiendo a sus necesidades. Cada vez que Jesús compartió una comida con sus seguidores, abrió sus corazones y sus mentes. Mientras seguimos compartiendo la comida eucarística, Jesús continúa alimentándonos y nutriéndonos con una nueva visión, una comprensión más profunda y un mayor amor.

EL PREGÓN PASCUAL



Durante estos 50 días de Pascua, la Iglesia nos da la oportunidad de “desentrañar” el significado y los ritos de la Pascua. Para los recién bautizados, esto se llama tiempo de mistagogía, el estudio de los misterios de la fe.

Así como algunas familias sacan lo mejor de todo para ocasiones especiales, la Iglesia hace lo mismo. Dos magníficas oraciones forman parte de la Vigilia Pascual, pero a menudo no tomamos el tiempo para releerlas o reflexionar sobre ellas. El Exsultet es el himno de alabanza que se canta justo después de que el Cirio Pascual ha sido llevado a la iglesia para iluminar a la comunidad mediante la participación en la Luz de Cristo. Hemos completado nuestro diálogo cantado: “La Luz de Cristo.” “Demos gracias a Dios.” Ahora, en esta oración cantada, llamamos a los ángeles, a la tierra y a la Iglesia a regocijarse, tanto que pedimos que este santo edificio tiemble de alegría con las voces del pueblo.

CON JESÚS RESUCITADO

Mientras escuchamos la lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, oímos que

Pedro y los apóstoles están dispuestos a desafiar al Sanedrín y continuar predicando y enseñando acerca de Jesucristo, dando testimonio de su fe y valentía. ¡Qué contraste ha obrado la gracia del Espíritu Santo en ellos! Han cambiado sus decisiones previas frente al arresto, pasión y muerte de Jesús. Las apariciones post-resurrección de Jesús y su interacción con los apóstoles han hecho la diferencia. Han pasado tiempo con el Cristo resucitado y han recibido el Espíritu Santo.

Cada domingo durante la temporada de Pascua, la Iglesia nos ofrece la primera lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, contándonos sobre la vida de los discípulos en la Iglesia primitiva, su testimonio, desafíos y las bendiciones de difundir la Buena Nueva. Hoy escuchamos sobre la preparación de una comida matutina de pescado y pan que Jesús comparte con los discípulos. También oímos, en el Evangelio de este domingo, la triple afirmación de Pedro sobre su amor por Jesús. La respuesta de Jesús es darle a Pedro la misión de alimentar el rebaño: los creyentes que vendrán a escuchar la Buena Nueva y serán nutridos por ella.

Compartimos esa nueva vida cuando escuchamos la Palabra y la acogemos en nuestro corazón. Porque hemos experimentado la vida nueva de la Pascua—una vida renovada y más profunda en Cristo—podemos tener el valor que Pedro nos mostró: proclamar nuestro amor por Dios una y otra vez. Podemos entregar nuestra vida y nuestro corazón a Dios porque primero hemos recibido vida de Él. A pesar de los desafíos y pruebas de fe que encontramos en el mundo, estamos llamados a ser discípulos fieles y valientes. Esa es la gracia de la Confirmación y la fortaleza que recibimos en el don de la Eucaristía. Cada domingo la Iglesia nos invita y nos llama a celebrar la Eucaristía porque necesitamos esa gracia y la comunión y el apoyo de la comunidad para continuar siendo discípulos fieles.

Dios ha llenado las redes de nuestra vida con muchas bendiciones. ¿Somos conscientes de esas bendiciones y cómo respondemos a los dones de Dios? Acercar a otros a Jesús no significa hacer grandes cosas, sino vivir nuestra vida cotidiana en el espíritu del Evangelio—reflejando la abundancia de bendiciones que Dios nos ha dado y la fe que habita en nosotros.

Lord, You know I love You!

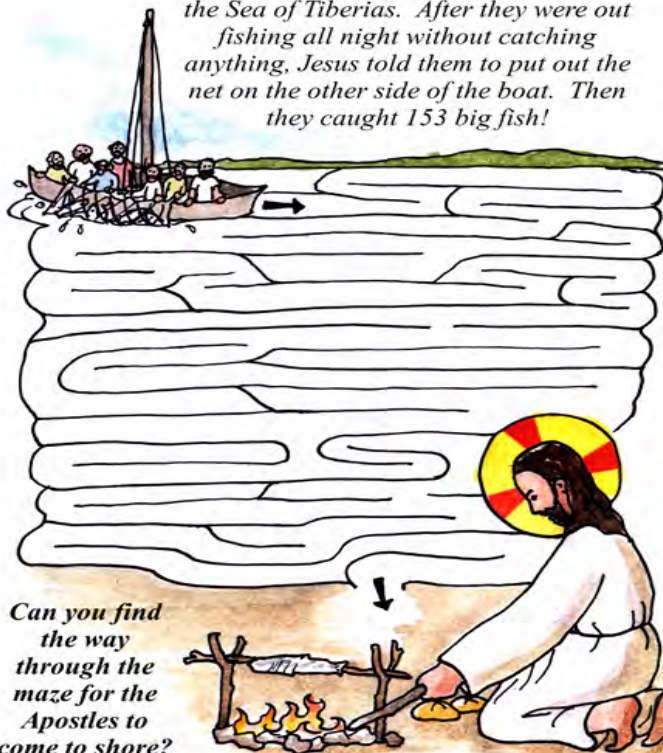

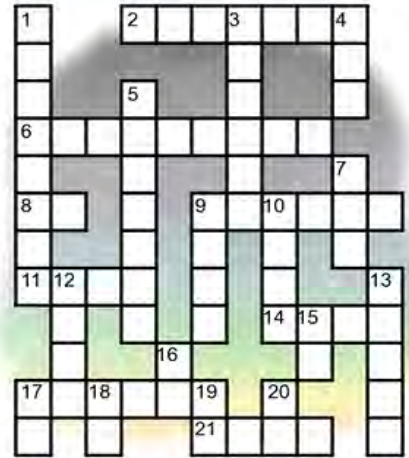

ST. DAMIEN WAS BORN IN BELGIUM IN 1840. HE HAD TO QUIT SCHOOL AT 13 TO WORK ON THE FARM. EVERY DAY HE PRAYED IN FRONT OF A PICTURE OF ST. FRANCIS XAVIER, PATRON OF MISSIONARIES.



HE JOINED A RELIGIOUS ORDER AND WHEN HIS BROTHER GOT SICK, HE TOOK HIS PLACE ON A MISSION TO HAWAII.



DAMIEN WAS ORDAINED A PRIEST IN HONOLULU AT THE AGE OF 24.



AT THAT TIME PEOPLE WITH LEPROSY WERE QUARANTINED ON THE ISLAND OF MOLOKAI.

DAMIEN VOLUNTEERED TO GO THERE, EVEN THOUGH HE KNEW HE MIGHT CATCH THE DISEASE.



HE CARED FOR THE PEOPLE AND BUILT CHURCHES AND HOSPITALS. HE MADE LIFE MUCH BETTER FOR THEM.

FATHER DAMIEN GOT LEPROSY HIMSELF WHEN HE WAS 45. HE CONTINUED TO WORK WITH THE PEOPLE AS LONG AS HE COULD. HE DIED AT AGE 49 AND WAS BURIED ON THE ISLAND.

RECOGNIZING THE PRESENCE OF JESUS

The readings of the Easter Season continue to unfold for us the great Easter Mystery - the enduring presence of

Jesus among us and what 'new life in Christ' might mean. The Gospel today recounts the third appearance of Jesus to the disciples after his resurrection. At first, they don't recognize him; then there is a huge haul of fish followed by a meal; then, in the long version of this Gospel, Peter's commission to lead the flock in love. It takes faith to recognize the presence of Jesus among us. Reality can be changed, and good things result when we do. All the meals we share are reminders of the Eucharistic Meal which keeps us in communion with the life of the Risen Christ and with one another. Jesus continues to be nourishment and strength for the journey. Our faith is built on love. In his dialogue with Christ, Peter reaffirms his love for him three times, reversing his triple denial of Jesus before the crucifixion. Peter is leader, but his leadership is built on his love of Christ. It is not the authority of tyranny, but of pastoral care. Peter is to 'Feed my lambs' - the young, the vulnerable. He is to 'look after my sheep' - feeding and caring for the flock, seeing to their needs. Whenever Jesus shared a meal with his followers, he opened their hearts and minds. As we continue to share in the Eucharistic Meal, Jesus continues to feed and nourish us with fresh insight, deeper understanding and greater love

Do you remember Peter on the night Jesus was arrested? He claimed he had never heard of Jesus. Today we are called to join Peter in testifying to the name of Jesus as he does in the first reading, and in proclaiming our love for him as Peter does in the Gospel passage. The powerful imagery of John's vision in the second reading from the book of Revelation shows us the company we keep when we have faith in the name of Jesus. We join all living creatures, "countless in number" from "heaven, earth, under the earth, in the sea; everything in the universe"

(Revelation 5:11, 13). The dignity and majesty described in each reading are in stark contrast to the dark and pitiful image of Peter and the other apostles at the time of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. What a relief that we can all be redeemed so completely!

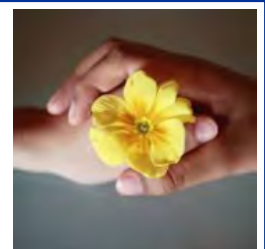

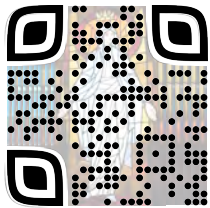
