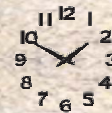

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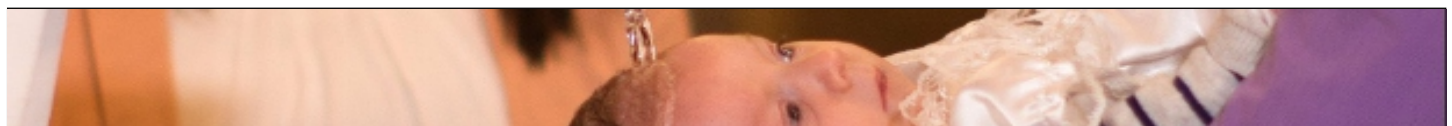

## REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD AND GROWING IN FAITH EACH DAY

February 11, 2024  
6th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:  
CALLED TO CHANGE

This is a week of change, of spiritual conversion and commitment. Midweek we encounter Ash Wednesday. So the Scriptures of today speak to us on several "layers". The first reading this Sunday is well paired with the Gospel to help us understand the New Law that Jesus brings to us. The Jewish Law commanded lepers and those unclean to be separated from the community, to be locked in the misery of their illness. In biblical times, as we read in the Book of Leviticus, many different illnesses were broadly included in the term "leprosy". Our thoughts, therefore, include all of us who need healing from Jesus, and also all those to whom we can bring some form of compassion and healing. The people of Corinth, and all of us, are reminded in Paul's letter to be imitators of Christ. All the Scriptures – the readings, the Responsorial Psalm 32 ("I turn to you, Lord, in times of trouble") call us to not only turn our own hearts and minds to God, but also to continually reach out to serve others, to listen and discern their needs and to "be Christ" to them in daily life.

The New Law is one of love and compassion; Jesus exemplifies it by his healing the leper. While there is an understandable fear and caution of illness and contagion, we also are reminded that the need for healing is a call for compassion. The faith we claim through our baptism is a faith that needs to be lived out in service to others – and it is in the Eucharist that we receive both the message and the nourishment to continue to mission of Jesus in witnessing to the Good News by our compassion and service to others. With the help of God's grace, we can become ever more faithful in our discipleship.

**As we prepare for Ash Wednesday this week, the readings this Sunday are focused on turning to the Lord.**

This is a call to prepare for Lent, to shape our lives and conversion around the "prayer, fasting and almsgiving" of Lent. Perhaps our Lenten focus can be on being more intentional about our doing the Lord's work each day. Especially may we be attentive and reach out to those who are, in our world today, the "outcasts" and marginalized, the ill and disabled, and mirror the compassion and care of Jesus towards others. May we live daily in the spirit of Jesus so that we may be of service to those we meet and with whom we work, continuing to grow in our understanding of Jesus as the center of our lives.

### CHRIST IS PRESENT!!



This is what we have known, believed with all our heart, since our faith formation and preparation for Communion first began. Christ is present in the Mass, in the Eucharist. It was in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, promulgated by the Second Vatican Council, that a deeper and more complete explanation and meditation was given to us. Christ is present in the priest who presides at Mass, who leads us in prayer and worship. Through the Holy Spirit and the grace of ordination he brings about the presence of Christ Jesus in a special way in the elements of bread and wine at the words of Consecration.

Christ is present in the Word, the Scriptures proclaimed at Mass, the Old Testament and the New Testament. It is the Lord God who speaks to us through the Word. We honor the Word by our attentiveness and especially by standing to hear the Gospel, learning more about the life and words of Jesus Christ.

Christ Jesus is present in us, the assembled people as we gather to worship. In us! In one another!  
Think about that, in awe. Amen!



## Día Mundial del Matrimonio

El día Mundial del Matrimonio resalta la unión de los esposos en una sola carne.

La observancia del día Mundial del Matrimonio (11 de Febrero) representa una oportunidad para concentrarse en construir una cultura de la vida y del amor que comienza por apoyar y promover el matrimonio y la familia. El tema de este año, "Matrimonio... una sola carne, entregada y recibida", resalta la unión en una sola carne de los esposos querida así por Dios. Hace hincapié también en el don personal que cada esposo hace mutuamente. Estos conceptos refieren a Cristo quien se da a sí mismo bajo la apariencia del pan y del vino—en cuanto verdadero cuerpo y sangre suyos.



Una característica peculiar de la primera parte del Evangelio según san Marcos es que en general Jesús obra un milagro y luego le dice al beneficiario del milagro que no se lo cuente a nadie. Se ha especulado mucho al respecto: Marcos está preparando el terreno para el gran "secreto" que se revelará cuando Pedro proclame que Jesús es el Mesías en Cesárea de Filipo; otros comentaristas más escépticos sostienen que Jesús, quien era plenamente consciente de su naturaleza humana, sabía que la mejor manera de difundir la Buena Nueva era pidiéndole a las personas que la mantuvieran en secreto. La reflexión de esta manera de guardar el secreto que nos resulta muy útil, sin embargo, es que Jesús estaba comenzando su ministerio público de la forma en que describe Pablo: lo estaba haciendo por la gloria de Dios, no para beneficio propio sino para beneficio de todos. Pablo después escribiría a los filipenses que Jesús "se rebajó a sí mismo" para parecerse a nosotros. Y vemos cómo esta humildad se pone en práctica hoy en la curación del leproso. Jesús está intentando revelar la presencia del Reino de Dios entre las personas, no para recibir gloria sino para que Dios fuera glorificado por él. Imitar esta forma de obrar, lo cual Pablo sugiere que hagan las facciones judías y griegas cristianas de Corintio, todavía nos resulta muy útil hoy.

Según la tradición, san Valentín, en el año 270, contradijo al emperador y casó a varias parejas después de que el emperador hubiese prohibido el matrimonio para mandar los hombres al ejército. Valentín fue encarcelado y allí se enamoró de la hija ciega del carcelero (en aquel tiempo los obispos y los sacerdotes se podían casar). El santo le dio la vista a la muchacha y se hicieron novios. Llegado el día de su martirio Valentín le dejó una carta de despedida con el carcelero. La firmó "De tu Valentín". En algunos países latinoamericanos el 14 de febrero es la celebración del amor y la amistad. Los novios son importantes, pero la persona no puede vivir sólo con el amor de pareja. Los humanos estamos hechos para varios tipos de amor. Estamos hechos para el amor que nos trasciende a nosotros mismos. Este es el amor cristiano, el que no se limita a familia, amigos. El que es valiente, como lo significa Valentín, ama a todos aun a la persona que es diferente a uno. (San Valentín no está hoy día ni en el Santoral ni en el Misal Romano.)

## CUARESMA

La Cuaresma es un tiempo de penitencia, por lo que es frecuente ofrecer al Señor un sacrificio, tanto para pedir la gracia de la conversión personal como para fortalecer la voluntad para



poder cooperar con esa gracia. Ambos fines van juntos porque sin Dios no podemos hacer nada (Jn 15,5). El mejor sacrificio que podemos hacer es dejar de pecar. Las liturgias de los primeros días de Cuaresma apelan a este tema de la vanidad de la oración y la penitencia sin conversión moral. Para los católicos, el examen de conciencia diario, la Confesión más asidua, así como la participación más frecuente en la Misa y Santa Comunión, en la medida en que la pandemia lo permite, son modos especialmente recomendables para prepararse para Pascua. Sería también aconsejable leer las Sagradas Escrituras, rezar la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia y el Santo Rosario, diariamente si es posible, meditando los textos y oraciones.

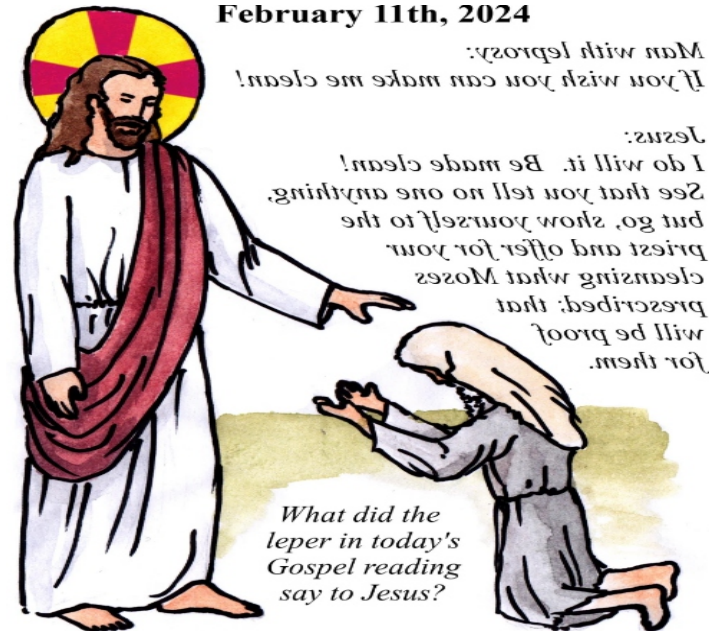

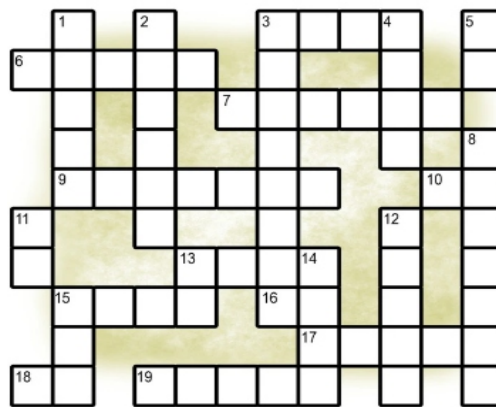

# THE HEALER

Today's Gospel centers on the plight of a leper and Jesus' response of healing. In Hawaii, the bacterium that causes leprosy probably entered from China in the mid-1800s, and the native islanders were susceptible to the dreaded disease. In 1866, the government literally

dumped the sufferers on a remote and virtually inaccessible island peninsula with towering cliffs. Thrown off ships into the sea, the sick people were told to swim for the beach and head for caves, and for seven years the only supplies were similarly cast into the sea to drift ashore. It was then, 1873, that a thirty-three-year-old Belgian priest, Damien de Veuster, went voluntarily to Kalaupapa. Before long, he cajoled the government into funding his mission and its hospital, built a village with proper homes and sanitation, and recruited Mother Marianne Cope to bring sisters from Syracuse, New York, to nurse the sick. Damien, who eventually died of leprosy, has been canonized, and Mother Marianne as well. Although leprosy has been curable since the 1940s, today a few patients remain in their lifelong home, now a national historic site. The peninsula is still utterly isolated from the outside world, and the speed limit for the few cars there is 5 mph since there's nowhere to go! The hospital is still well-staffed and equipped, but access is regulated and visitors must take an official tour, often involving a descent down the cliffs by "Molakai mule." There are few places on earth that evoke the healing power of Jesus, or our call to follow the Healer, more than Damien's beloved island mission.

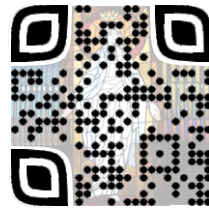
