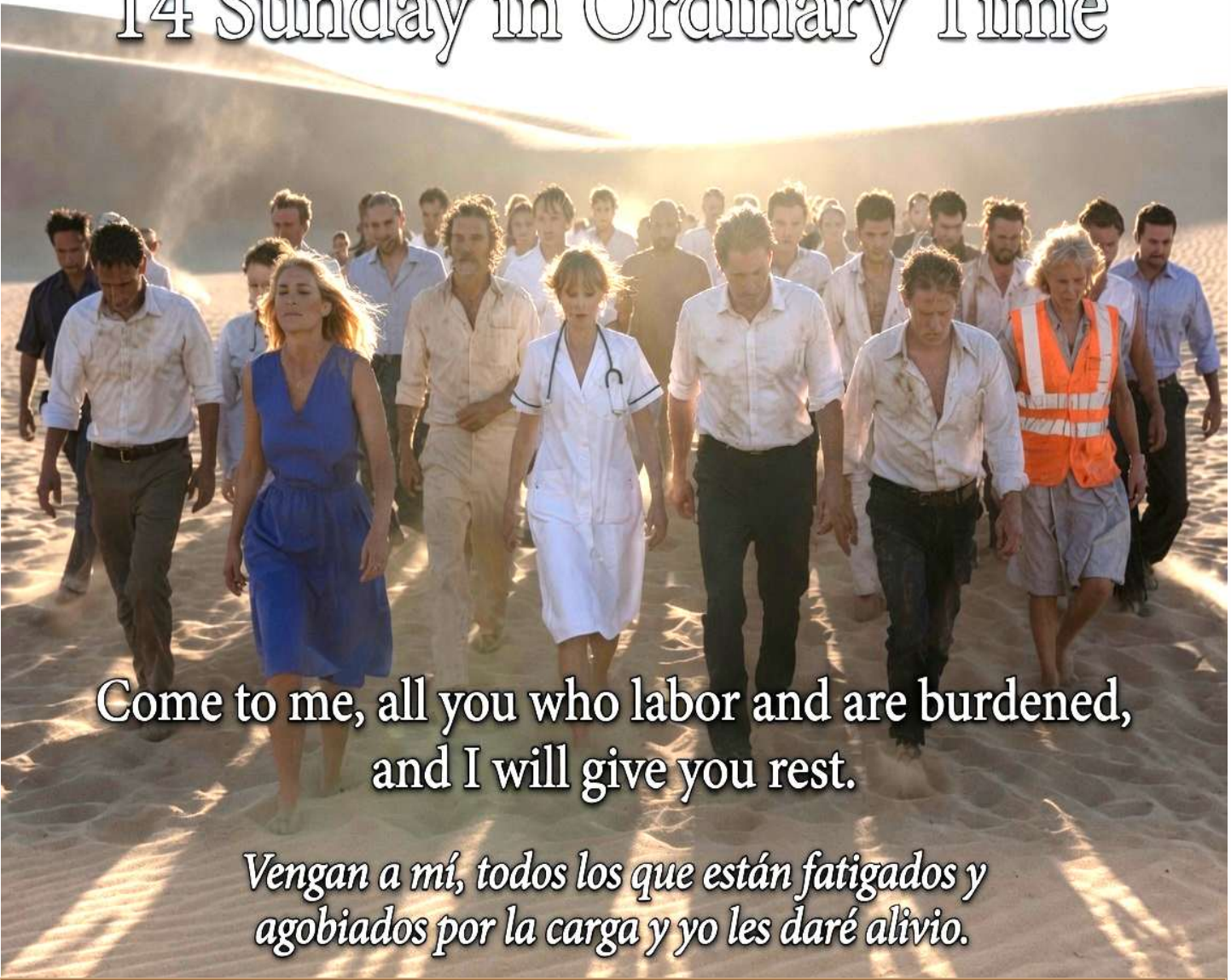

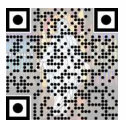

TRUST, HUMILITY AND
BURDENS

On this holiday weekend, we honor our country's founding fathers and the courage they embodied in writing and signing the declaration of independence. There must have been courage and faith in that endeavor. Even looking at our country's money units, we see "In God We Trust". That is something that we take so much for granted, that there are profound religious and human moral values that are the underpinning of our country.

Eventually we learn in life that it takes true humility and trust to become a true disciple of Jesus Christ. Recognizing that this is a lifelong journey of insight and growth, we can let go our own need to be honored, admired, or praised.

The Scriptures these weeks give us continuing reassurance from the Old Testament, the Letter to the Romans and the Gospel of Matthew that God is our protector, that Jesus is the fulfillment of the hopes and prophecies of the Old Testament. That reassurance has a "follow-up": last week we heard the admonition to lose our lives for the sake of Jesus, to give to the "little ones", basically to serve others, the needy, without expecting a reward here on earth. This Sunday's Gospel extends the care of God toward us, inviting us to come to Him and He will give us rest. But we are also called to take up the yoke of Christ, humbly carrying our burden in a trusting way. Not only is the Lord our constant companion on our journey, but we also are companions to one another.

This is not, however, a promise that life will be easy once we give ourselves to the service of the Lord. It is a promise that the Lord will be always with us. Whether it is the prophets who faithfully proclaimed the Covenant with God, or Paul, who together with the other apostles, carried out the mission given to them by Jesus, trust in God was their strength. As we faithfully seek God's will, we turn to the Lord who offers us the peace of heart we hunger for. Matthew's vision of the kingdom is one in which we carry our burdens with grace and trust in God.

FULLY ACTIVE IN LITURGY



Some of the most challenging and transformative documents of the Church in modern times may be the

four Constitutions from the Second Vatican Council from 1962-1965. **The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy** is the first documents of the Council, when over 2500 persons - the Holy Father, bishops, archbishops and cardinals, theological experts, scholars and observers - gathered, prayed, studied and focused on the present and future of Catholicism.

The work of the Council Fathers was the renewal of the Church and its liturgy, the study and use of the Scriptures, greater attentiveness to the role and life of the Church in the world, and the relationship of the Roman Catholic Church with other Christian and non-Christian religions.

For most of the membership of the Church, the renewal of the liturgy generated the greatest awareness of the impact of the renewal. In Catholic liturgy, the role of the people is not to be passive spectators, but to **engage in "full, conscious, and active participation."** Derived from the Greek *leitourgia*, meaning the "**work of the people**" or "public work done on behalf of the people," liturgy is an action of the entire Mystical Body of Christ—both Christ the Head and the assembled faithful. Through their baptism, the laity possess a right and a duty to co-offer the sacrifice of praise to the Father. This is our response to God's great gift of His Son and our redemption.

Our share in the dialogues and responses, singing, attentiveness to the words and prayers of our celebrant, appropriate movement and gestures, and our personal and shared express our faith and relationship to our loving and ever-present God in Christ Jesus through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

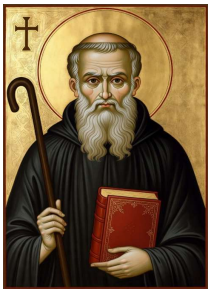

San Benedicto de Nursia

San Benedicto de Nursia, también conocido como San Benito ©. 480-547), fue un monje italiano fundador del monacato occidental y de la Orden Benedictina. Nacido en una familia noble de Nursia (actual Norcia, Italia), abandonó

San Benedicto de Nursia, también conocido como San Benito ©. 480-547), fue un monje italiano fundador del monacato occidental y de la Orden Benedictina. Nacido en una familia noble de Nursia (actual Norcia, Italia), abandonó sus estudios en Roma disgustado por la corrupción moral de la ciudad y se retiró como ermitaño en una cueva de Subiaco, donde vivió en oración y penitencia. Posteriormente fundó doce monasterios, alrededor del año 529, estableció el famoso monasterio de Montecassino, donde escribió su influyente Regla de San Benito, un texto equilibrado que combina oración ("ora"), trabajo manual ("labora"), estudio, humildad y obediencia comunitaria, convirtiéndose en la base de la vida monástica en Europa durante la Edad Media. Venerado como santo por la Iglesia Católica (su fiesta se celebra el 11 de julio) y declarado Patrono de Europa por Pablo VI en 1964, su legado espiritual y cultural fue fundamental para la preservación del conocimiento y la civilización cristiana tras la caída del Imperio Romano. - biocath.info

El Laico que Amó la Liturgia: Vida y Legado de Carlos Manuel Rodríguez

En el año 2001, Carlos Manuel Rodríguez Santiago se convirtió en el primer laico caribeño beatificado por la Iglesia. Su vida fue ejemplar en la caridad y en el amor a la liturgia, pues promovió la participación de los fieles de una manera activa, mucho antes de que el Concilio Vaticano II así lo pidiera. En 1963 una colitis rectal muy severa le llevó a los brazos de Cristo resucitado, a la edad de 44 años. Carlitos, como muchos lo llaman, trabajó en la Universidad de Puerto Rico y fundó un grupo apostólico laical en el Centro Católico de dicha universidad. Allí pudo obrar por el desarrollo del humanismo cristiano, la participación activa de los laicos en la liturgia de la Iglesia y por la renovación de la Vigilia Pascual. Solía decir que los cristianos "vivimos para esa noche" como cumbre y centro de nuestra fe. Carlitos es modelo para los laicos comprometidos con su fe. Él insistía no sólo en una participación activa en la pastoral de la Iglesia, sino también en la liturgia de la Iglesia en una época donde la Misa todavía se consideraba obra exclusiva de los sacerdotes.

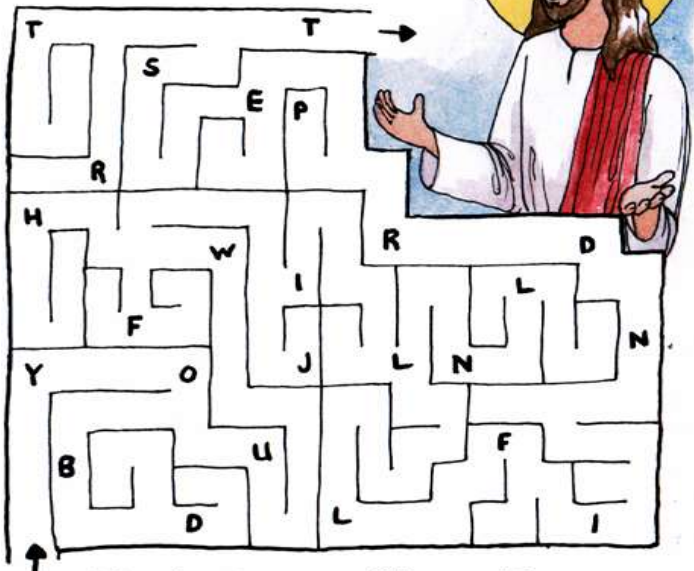

THE CHURCH DOOR BRIDE



The premier poet of the English language, Geoffrey Chaucer, introduced one of his most beloved characters, the "Wife of Bath," by this telling remark: "Husbands at church door she had five." Four times widowed, she was setting off on a pilgrimage, notably without number five. The church door is a curious detail, pointing to the fourteenth-century wedding custom of marrying on the porch of the parish church. The goal was to give maximum publicity to the consent of the groom and bride, and so consent was moved from the bride's home to a public venue. The priest would stand in the doorway and begin by sprinkling the couple with holy water. He needed to make sure they weren't too closely related and give them some instruction. He would direct the groom to pay the bride's family a dowry, and then announce the monetary amounts to the interested passersby. Only then would the guests enter the church for the wedding Mass, during which the bride and groom would hold lighted candles. The gradual move from home to church and the shift from the bride's father to the priest's authority helped to protect the freedom of brides who weren't quite as confident as the Wife of Bath. —Rev. James Field

TECHNOLOGY IS NEVER NEUTRAL



A central thread running through Magnifica Humanitas is that technology — including AI — is never neutral. It "takes on the characteristics of those who devise, finance, regulate, and use it." AI systems, no matter how sophisticated, lack consciousness, moral conscience, lived experience, and the capacity for genuine relationship or self-giving love. The Pope warns against the technocratic paradigm that reduces human beings to data points or efficiency metrics and critiques visions of transhumanism or posthumanism that seek to "surpass" or replace human limitation and vulnerability. Human dignity, he insists, is infinite and inalienable — it does not need to be earned through productivity or optimization. — Pole Leo XIV
