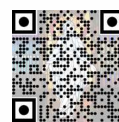

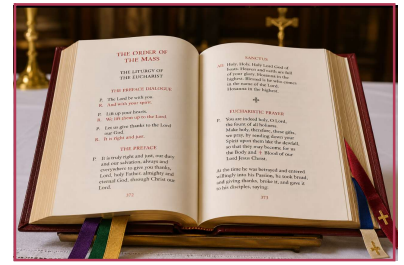

The Richness of the Church's Eucharistic Prayers



The achievement of the late 1960s and early 1970s in enriching the "euchology" or "words of thanksgiving" available in the Church's prayer is important on many levels. Ecumenically, it means that the Latin Rite now reflects the wealth of the East in having more than one prayer available to the Church. Pastorally, it actually acknowledges the place of the assembly in prayer, which is particularly clear in the Masses with Children. In fact, the traditional prayers of the Eastern Church served as models for our new prayers.

In the East, what we call the Eucharistic Prayer is called the anaphora, and there are three main families of anaphora. Each family has a different "recipe" for arranging the usual parts of these prayers. All anaphora have "intercessions" included, but the Churches of Antioch place them toward the end of the prayer, Alexandria prefers them at the beginning before the "Holy, Holy," and Syria puts them at the very end. One branch of the Syrian family is unique in not mentioning the words of Jesus at the Last Supper. The Roman Canon we once prayed exclusively has some connection with the Alexandrian family, but once the signal for creativity was given, all the wealth of every prayer tradition was on the table, and our Sunday Mass has been greatly enriched.

17th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:
CHOICES AND GOD'S WISDOM

For several weeks now, the Gospels have been offering us wisdom through the parables of Jesus. Through them, Jesus has been giving insights into the reign of God, guides for the choices of those who seek to follow Jesus. Both in times past and in our times, recognizing God's rule requires discernment and choices. That process involves search and discovery. Once we find a treasure, or a precious pearl, we have to make a choice about what to do about it. And following up on a choice requires action. It's like that with many choices in our daily lives too. For each of us also there are those special, more monumental, times when decisions become more life-changing. Discerning God's will involves identifying God's presence and God's call to us to respond.

Spiritual discernment is a process of wisdom. In the first reading we hear about Solomon's recognition of his need for God's grace, guidance, and help – wisdom. That treasured wisdom helps him not only judge things rightly, it also offers him in insight into what it means to understand the will of God. The Responsorial Psalm affirms the importance of the commitment to hear and follow the Word, the Law, the decrees of God. The short reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans brings to us the promise of God's blessing, justification and glorification for those who are faithful to God. "All things work for good for those who love God."

When we live by faith, the challenges that we encounter in life bring us, at some point, to our knees, to ask for God, as Solomon did, for the wisdom we need to have an understanding heart, to judge rightly, to distinguish right from wrong. For us, that may require some risk-taking at times, to challenge the status quo, to go outside our comfort zone. Sometimes, hearing about or reading about those who have stepped out in faith in the face of ungodly actions, those who have gone before us – or thinking about those in our own times – present us with a challenge: what does the Word of God call us to do? What is the Gospel message that we hear and must discern what it means to respond and be faithful to? The Beatitudes. The Two Great Commandments. The criteria of judgment in Matthew 25. That is the wisdom.

What are our choices?



LEX ORANDI, LEX CREDENDI

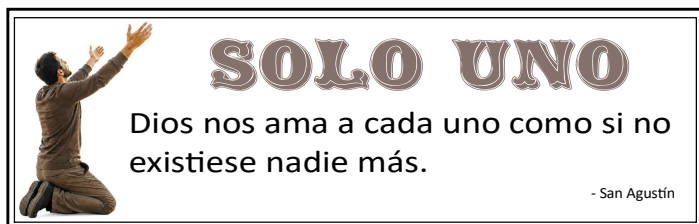
Listening carefully can be dangerous. Paying attention to the prayers of the Church is a marvelous way to proclaim our beliefs as persons of faith. There is a three-part Latin saying that encapsulates that: **Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi, Lex Vivendi**. Pope Paul VI, in 1975, in a general audience, commented on the relationship between faith and prayer, saying: "We must all hold fast and joyously to the conviction that the *lex orandi* (rule of prayer) possesses in the *lex credendi* (rule of faith) its guiding light and measure; the rule of faith is the word received; the Liturgy is the word expressed." We are sent forth from the Liturgy to live the Word we have heard and prayed. In 1966, the Pope required of the liturgical experts working on the renewal of the Liturgy that the prayer they were forming for the Church preserve the richness of dogma and that the religious language be suited to the truths of faith and the balanced expression of the values being celebrated.

The third part of the saying, "**lex vivendi**", (rule of living) has been added through the catechetical ministries, social action and formation ministries of the Church. Translated in everyday vernacular, the whole saying gives us guidance: **the law of our prayer expresses the law of our belief which guides the law of our living.** In other words, our prayer expresses our beliefs which guides the way we live, day by day. The choices we make and the priorities we live by are to be consistent with our beliefs and our prayers. There is a song popular in churches a while ago that expresses it this way: "They'll know we are Christian by our love." When we think of Matthew's Gospel, chapter 25, and the words of the Son of Man at the end of the world, we hear that what matters is that the rule of faith and the rule of belief have guided us to be compassionate and generous toward those in need.

Virgen de COPACABANA

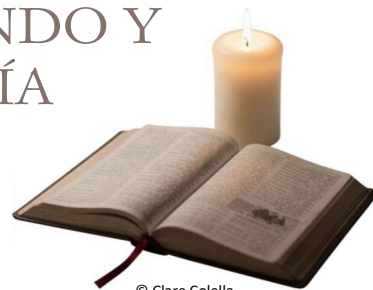
Esta semana celebramos la fiesta de la Virgen de Copacabana. Copacabana es la capital de Manco Cápac, Bolivia. En dicho lugar, un descendiente de los reyes incas, Francisco Tito Yupanqui buscó

esculpir una imagen de la Candelaria. Su primera imagen fue colocada en la iglesia por su párroco, pero llegó un nuevo párroco quien la sacó del templo por tosca y fea. El pobre de Tito viajó a Potosí, Bolivia, donde emprendió cursos de escultura. Con el tiempo esculpió otra imagen de la Candelaria. Esta vez estudió varias imágenes de María y mandó ofrecer una Misa a la Santísima Trinidad pidiéndole la inspiración necesaria para esculpir una imagen digna de la Virgen. Los años de práctica en su arte, unidos a su devoción, le ayudaron a esculpir una imagen fina y bella que en 1583 fue colocada en su propio santuario. La Virgen de Copacabana tiene uno de los primeros santuarios marianos en América Latina. Curiosamente, se celebra el 5 de agosto, día que María hizo nevar en la antigua ciudad de Roma, Italia, para mostrar dónde deseaba tener su primer templo.

ELIGIENDO Y SABIDURÍA DE DIOS



Durante varias semanas, los Evangelios han estado ofreciendo sabiduría a través de las parábolas de Jesús. A través de ellas, Jesús ha estado dando insights sobre el reino de Dios, guías para las elecciones de aquellos que buscan seguir a Jesús. Tanto en tiempos pasados como en los nuestros, reconocer la regla de Dios requiere discernimiento y elecciones. Ese proceso implica búsqueda y descubrimiento. Una vez que encontramos un tesoro, o una perla preciosa, tenemos que tomar una decisión sobre qué hacer al respecto. Y seguir adelante con una elección requiere acción. Es como si con muchas elecciones en nuestra vida diaria también hay momentos especiales, más monumentales, cuando las decisiones se vuelven más transformadoras. Discernir la voluntad de Dios implica identificar la presencia de Dios y su llamado a responder.

El discernimiento espiritual es un proceso de sabiduría. En la primera lectura escuchamos sobre el reconocimiento de Salomón de su necesidad de la gracia, guía y ayuda de Dios. Esa sabiduría atesorada no solo ayuda a juzgar las cosas correctamente; también le ofrece insight sobre lo que significa entender la voluntad de Dios. El Salmo Responsorial afirma la importancia del compromiso de escuchar y seguir la Palabra, la Ley, los decretos de Dios. La breve lectura de la Carta de Pablo a los Romanos nos trae la Promesa de la bendición, justificación y glorificación de Dios para aquellos que son fieles a Dios. "Todas las cosas ayudan para bien a los que aman a Dios".



Cuando vivimos por fe, los desafíos que encontramos en la vida nos traen, en algún momento, a nuestras rodillas, para pedir a Dios, como Salomón hizo, por la sabiduría que necesitamos para tener un corazón comprensivo, para juzgar correctamente, para distinguir el bien del mal. Para

nosotros, eso puede requerir cierto riesgo en algunos momentos, para desafiar el statu quo, para salir de nuestra zona de confort. A veces, al escuchar o leer sobre aquellos que han dado un paso en la fe ante acciones indignas, aquellos que han ido antes que nosotros —o pensando sobre aquellos en nuestros propios tiempos— se presenta como un desafío: ¿qué nos llama a hacer la Palabra de Dios? ¿Qué es el mensaje del Evangelio que escuchamos y debemos discernir qué significa responder y ser fieles? Las Bienaventuranzas. Los Dos Grandes Mandamientos. Los criterios de juicio en Mateo 25. Esa es la sabiduría.

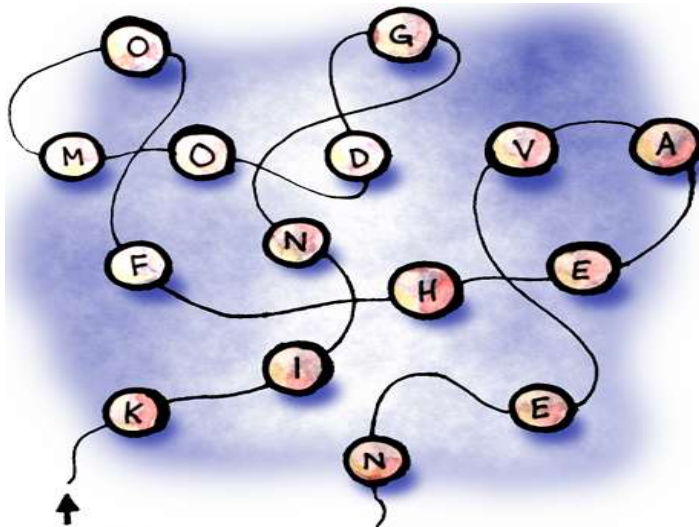
hidden. He also says it is like a pearl of great price, that when a merchant finds it he sells all he has and buys it.

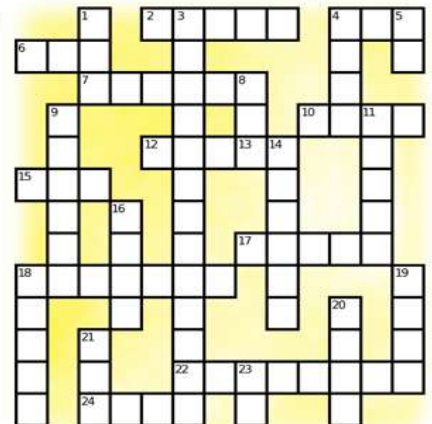

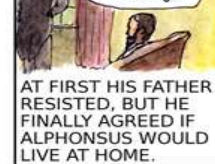

WHILE VISITING THE SICK HE RECEIVED A VISION THAT INFLUENCED HIM TO BECOME A PRIEST.



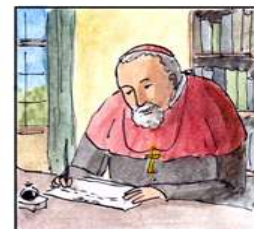
I don't want you staying in the Oratory.
