

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD AND LIVING OUR FAITH EACH DAY

March 3, 2024 THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: THIRSTING FOR GOD © Clare Colella

Today the Church offers the option of the Mass and readings of Cycle B or Cycle A

which pertain to the First Scrutiny which we will hear at the Mass during which a Scrutiny is being celebrated. A Scrutiny is a special rite for those who are preparing for Christian Initiation at the upcoming Easter Vigil. These Elect (so called because they have been chosen by God to become part of His People as Catholic Christians and have been affirmed by the Bishop) are keeping Lent as the final period of preparation, purification and enlightenment recognizing their own human weakness and need for the grace, the Holy Spirit and the guidance of God in their lives.

The first reading of Cycle B from the Book of Exodus gives us the Commandments which are to be the guide for the lives of the Chosen People – both in ancient times and now. These are the foundational commands by which our lives are to be shaped. As we reflect on these commands, we can understand their wisdom. We live out these laws in the spirit of response to our loving and caring God. God has entered into a Covenant with us, and our call to discipleship of Jesus Christ is built on the spirit of these laws lived in the framework of the two great commandments given us by Jesus: Love God with your whole heart and being and love your neighbor as yourself.

The Cycle B Gospel is taken from John's Gospel, the story of the cleansing of the temple is found in all the Gospels though John's Gospel puts it much earlier in the public ministry of Jesus. There are nuances here that are significant – that it is zeal for the house of God that precipitates the actions of Jesus, and Jesus' dialogue with the Jews makes a reference to his death and resurrection.

The readings of Cycle A focus on the gift of Living Water of which Jesus speaks to the woman at the well in Samaria (John 4:5-42). Just as, In Exodus, the miraculous water from the rock in the time of Moses gave life to the traveling Hebrews, so the water of life, of baptism, give us new life — which we live out in the spirit of the Law of God.

Our reflection on today's readings can serve as an examination of our lives: how faithful are we to the commandments of God and to the teachings of Jesus? As we grow through our Lenten practices, are we, in fact, becoming more faithful? What needs to be cleansed from our hearts, from our behaviors, in order that we might become better disciples and prepare for the celebration of our renewal of our baptismal promises during the coming Easter celebrations? Are we entering more deeply into the Paschal Mystery – including our own dying to self in order to rise to new life in Christ?

DOXOLOGY AND AMEN



These two words - and the prayers which they are - signify a crucial part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. A doxology is a prayer of praise, giving glory to God, usually honoring the Trinity. The most familiar prayer may be the "Glory be to the Father" that we pray during the Rosary, at the close of psalms in the Liturgy of the Hours, or often spontaneously when moved by the Spirit.

The one-word prayer "Amen" is both ancient and venerable, and comes to us from the Aramaic Hebrew language through the Greek as a word of affirmation and assent. It has many uses throughout the whole Scripture and in prayer. The basic root meaning is "firm", "truly" or "sure" It is a covenant word, used to express a pledge to fulfill a vow, centered on the idea of the truth of God. It connotes faithfulness and steadfastness. It is assent to a truth that has been expressed.

Our Liturgy of the Mass has several doxologies: the major doxology, the "Glory to God" is sung before the Opening Prayer of the Sunday Mass in seasons other than Advent or Lent and also on feasts and solemnities. The most solemn doxology is never set aside: it concludes the Eucharistic Prayer; the Eucharist is a prayer of praise to the Father through the Son in union with the Holy Spirit. At this sacred time, all the saints in heaven, the faithful departed, we pray in behalf of all living persons and all creation offer praise: "Through Him and with Him, and in Him, O God, Almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever." As a community of faith and as individuals covenanted with God, we offer our sung prayer, the "Great Amen". The best response ever!

Como proclama el Salmo 19 (18): "Los mandatos del Señor son rectos y alegran el corazón" (19 [18]:8). Nuestro descanso del domingo es un gran regalo que debemos recibir de Dios con alegría, no poniendo peros. - Arch 18 JSP



CYCLE A

The Scrutinies are three special rites that help prepare the Elect, those participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), to enter the Catholic Church. They take place during the period of RCIA formation known as

Purification and Enlightenment, near the end of their formation. The season of Lent involves a more intense period of examination and preparation for the Elect, and hopefully for those of us already living the Catholic faith. Though they are meant for the RCIA Elect, the Scrutinies can help all Catholics seeking to live a life of continuous conversion. The purpose of the Scrutinies is "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful" in the hearts of the Elect and to "strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good." Today we celebrate the first of the three scrutinies in our parish at the 10 a.m. Mass. The readings proclaimed in this particular Mass correspond to Cycle "A", focusing on coming to faith and living water (Jn 4: 1-42 - The Woman at the Well). Let us pray for our Elect in our parish community here at the Our Lady of the Assumption.


