

## SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT: TRANSFIGURING OUR LIVES

As we come to understand the wisdom of the Church in the selection and arrangements of readings for Sunday Liturgy we cherish all the

more the unfolding of the on-going mystery of God's love and compassion toward his people and toward us today.

Each year the Church begins the Sundays of Lent with the Gospel story of the temptations of Jesus. And each year, the Second Sunday of Lent tells us of the Transfiguration of Jesus. In today's account, from the Gospel of Matthew, we hear that Jesus and the three disciples went to a high mountain. It is Matthew's way of indicating to his readers that what happens there is truly important – because for the Jewish Christians mountains have been important places of encounter between God and his people. God speaks to the three apostles saying "This is my beloved Son on whom my favor rests. Listen to him." That powerful message comes to us as well. What do we hear when we listen to the words, actions and teachings of Jesus? How are we transfigured, changed, through our faithfulness in following Jesus?

The first reading, from Genesis, tells us God's promise to Abram (whose name was later changed to Abraham): for those who follow the Word of God, blessings will come. Abram and his family were changed – not only did they move to the land God showed them, but this was the beginning of many blessings for the family and descendants of Abram and Sarai (whose name was later changed to Sarah). Taking time to read all of chapter 12 and the following chapters in Genesis will help us understanding the enduring blessings of God to those who are faithful.

The Letter to Timothy says simply: Christ Jesus has robbed death of its power and has brought life and immortality to light. When we are faithful, God's blessing rests on us also. What is God's call to you? The risks of living faithfully, the cost of discipleship, are real. But we are never alone. Our full response to the call to holiness is not so much a giant leap as a steady continuing effort at being faithful to the best that God has given us. The Spirit of God dwells in us. Let us continue to pray for one another. Amen!

### A FAMILY LENT



A favorite memory from my years in Catholic school: during Lent, saving money to bring to school to contribute to the Holy Childhood collection, together with daily

prayer to help missionaries who worked in distant lands to spread the Gospel and help the people there. It is great to know that in our parish and school that kind of collection continues. The idea of saving money earned by doing extra chores or saved not buying treats and giving that money to the collection continues today too. I realize that I can help with that, because the extra donations for the Holy Childhood ministries or outreach to the needy will always be appreciated. Having the whole family participate in the planning, saving, and donating can bring about a shared sense of the Lenten spirit that can extend even beyond the season of "40 days".

There are so many other ways that we can share in the Lenten "pillar" of almsgiving and charity: affirming the goodness of others, speaking words of kindness, hope and peace, sharing what we have with others, giving of our time to listen to or help others. Simple gifts of ourselves are what we offer to God. Love is shown by and lives in the details: why and how we do what we do.

That same sense of deepening the spirit of Lent extends to the "pillar" of prayer. And think of prayer in the wider sense of developing our relationship with God in a way that supports all we do and think and say each day. Many of the saints have taught us that all of life can be holy when we live for Jesus and to seek and follow the will of God in our lives. Our time in prayer leads us closer to God.

## 2do DOMINGO DE CUARESMA



### Renovación Interior y Arrepentimiento a Través de la Obediencia

Mis queridísimos amigos en Cristo:

Bienvenidos al segundo domingo de nuestro camino cuaresmal con el Señor. Es un viaje desde el pecado hacia el arrepentimiento y la salvación. Debemos dejar atrás aquellas cosas (el estilo de vida pecaminoso) con las que nos hemos familiarizado, para caminar en obediencia al llamado de Dios hacia una nueva vida de arrepentimiento. Al igual que Abraham, Dios desea establecerte en una nueva tierra de gracia, donde puedas florecer y prosperar espiritualmente. Para lograrlo, debes dejar el lugar donde te encuentras ahora y dirigirte hacia donde Dios quiere que estés. Así es como ocurrirá tu transformación. La voz de Dios resuena desde lo más profundo de tu alma, instándote a abandonar esa vida pecaminosa para abrazar una nueva vida de gracia. Obedecer esta voz interior es fe.

Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan la necesidad de una transformación interior, que surge de la obediencia a la palabra de Dios, como en el caso de Abraham; y la experiencia de un conocimiento más profundo de Dios, como en el caso de los tres apóstoles. Nos encontramos en un tiempo de renovación interior y arrepentimiento. Abramos nuestros corazones a la palabra transformadora de Dios.

Mientras se prepara gradualmente el escenario para el cumplimiento de su misión terrena en Jerusalén, Jesús llevó a tres de sus discípulos a la montaña. Allí se transfiguró. La transfiguración permitió a Jesús consultar a su Padre celestial para conocer su plan respecto al sufrimiento, la muerte y la resurrección de su Hijo. Fue también una oportunidad para que sus discípulos elegidos tomaran conciencia de la gloria divina de Jesús, de modo que abandonaran sus ambiciones mundanas y sus sueños de un Mesías conquistador, y se fortalecieran para el tiempo de prueba que estaba a punto de llegar.

Antes de este encuentro en la cima de la montaña, narrado en Mateo 16, que prepara el terreno para la transfiguración, Jesús pregunta a sus discípulos quién es Él y les revela su misión de sufrimiento y muerte. Jesús enseñó a sus discípulos que el discipulado consiste en abrazar la cruz y no rechazarla, como Pedro pensaba. El capítulo 16 de Mateo establece así la identidad y la misión de Jesús. En el capítulo 17, que hemos escuchado hoy, Pedro, Santiago y Juan acompañaron a Jesús al monte de la transfiguración, de la misma manera que Aarón, Nadab y Abiú acompañaron a Moisés al monte Sinaí (Éxodo 24:1-9). Estos tres discípulos, Pedro, Santiago y Juan, no volverán a aparecer como círculo íntimo hasta Getsemaní (cf. Mateo 26:37). Allí acompañarán a Jesús mientras lucha durante la noche que culmina con su arresto (Mateo 26:36ss). La Transfiguración y Getsemaní son las dos experiencias más íntimas que Jesús comparte con sus discípulos, y los mismos tres fueron testigos de ambas. Así, Jesús fortalece la fe de estos tres para sumergirlos en una comprensión más profunda de su misión y también de la de ellos. Serán ellos quienes fortalezcan a los demás cuando Él ya no esté físicamente presente entre ellos.

Habría sido una presunción por parte de Jesús pensar que los discípulos lo conocían muy bien y que su fe era lo suficientemente fuerte para resistir el calor de la persecución que se avecinaba. Su incapacidad —excepto Pedro— para articular quién era Jesús cuando Él les preguntó sobre su identidad en el camino a Jerusalén en Cesarea de Filipo, revela su falta de comprensión de la verdadera identidad de Jesús. Hoy se da una confirmación celestial de la verdadera identidad y misión de Cristo en presencia de estos tres discípulos.

Sin duda, no todos, ni siquiera todos los seguidores de Cristo, comprenden lo que implica el discipulado. Muchos cristianos aman a Jesús, pero no quieren asociarse con su cruz (sus sufrimientos). Pablo recuerda a Timoteo y a nosotros que todos tenemos una parte en los sufrimientos de Cristo. En su segunda carta (segunda lectura) dice: “Querido hermano, comparte los sufrimientos por el Evangelio con la fuerza que viene de Dios”. Los discípulos nunca imaginaron el sufrimiento y la muerte como parte de su misión ni de la de Cristo. Nosotros también podríamos estar pensando de la misma manera. La cruz que cargamos transforma nuestra naturaleza pecaminosa, y esta transformación proviene de la acción interior de la gracia de Dios. Nuestro camino cuaresmal es la manera que Dios tiene de fortalecernos para las pruebas de la vida.

En momentos de duda, dolor, sufrimiento, decepción y desesperanza, necesitamos experiencias de “monte” para acercarnos a Dios y escuchar sus palabras consoladoras: “Este es mi Hijo amado, en quien me complazco”. Nuestra ‘penitencia cuaresmal’ nos conducirá a la ‘alegría pascual’.

La Cuaresma es un tiempo especial en el que seguimos de cerca a Cristo, como los tres discípulos, para comprenderlo más íntimamente y ser transformados por su gracia. Su gracia fortalece nuestra fe. Mientras meditamos en su pasión durante esta temporada, que perseveremos en la oración, el ayuno y el compartir su amor con los demás. Cada día de Cuaresma es una oportunidad para crecer en intimidad con Cristo. Cuanto más lo conocemos, menos probable será que lo abandonemos cuando lleguen las dificultades, porque comprenderemos que Él abrazó los sufrimientos en la cruz por nuestro propio bien.

Pedimos a Dios que nos fortalezca para escuchar la voz de su Hijo y transformar nuestro interior, a fin de perseverar en la fe.


## Elegidos
